The United General Assembly in 2022 designated 15 March as The International Day to Combat Islamophobia

For the commemoration of the first International Day to Combat Islamophobia, the United Nations General Secretary issued the following statement.

“The first International Day to Combat Islamophobia is a call for action to stamp out the poison of anti-Muslim hatred. Discrimination diminishes us all. We must stand up against it. Today and every day, we must counter the forces of division by reaffirming our common humanity”.



Azerbaijan, Baku (Baku, March 8), recognizing the importance of commemorating International Day to Combat Islamophobia, hosted an International Conference, “[Embracing Diversity: Tackling Islamophobia in 2024](#)”.

Yousef M. Al-Dobeay, the Assistant Secretary-General of Political Affairs of the Organization of Islamic Cooperation (OIC), reminded the world of the UN's designation of March 15 as the International Day to combat Islamophobia. “We have a great responsibility in this fight,” he added. Yousef M. Al-Dobeay further stressed the need to prevent oppression and discrimination against Muslims. “The OIC calls on international organizations and civil societies to unite and mobilize their efforts against these cases.”

The President of the G20 Interfaith Dialogue Forum, Prof. Cole Durham, said: “We must fight Islamophobia with all our strength and eradicate this problem.”

United Nations Secretary-General [António Guterres](#) observed this in his message for the second commemoration of the International Day to Combat Islamophobia (8 March 2024).

“The International Day to Combat Islamophobia occurs at a time when we see a rising tide of anti-Muslim hate and bigotry in many parts of the world.

Institutional discrimination and other barriers are violating the human rights and dignity of Muslims. Divisive rhetoric and misrepresentation are stigmatizing communities. Online hate speech is fueling real-life violence.

Digital platforms must moderate hateful content and protect users from harassment. And everyone must unite to combat intolerance, stereotypes, and bias”.

THE UNITED STATES ADMINISTRATION AND ISLAMOPHOBIA

Not to be left behind, and in response to the escalating situation, in November 2023, the [White House](#) announced its commitment to developing a national strategy to combat Islamophobia.

A SURGE IN ISLAMOPHOBIA IN 2023

Throughout 2023, there was a significant surge in Islamophobic incidents, particularly during the early months and escalating further with the Israel-Hamas war.

These incidents included the burning of the Quran, attacks on mosques, and mob lynching of Muslims.

In the USA and the UK alone, there was a staggering [growth of 172% and 140%](#), respectively, compared to the previous year.

The incidents accompanying the recent statistics range from verbal harassment to violence against Palestinian human rights supporters, represent “an unprecedented surge in bigotry,” CAIR’s Research and Advocacy Director Corey Saylor said in a statement released to [Al Jazeera](#).

THE YEAR 2023 ALSO UNMASKED WESTERN COUNTRY’S ISLAMOPHOBIA AND HYPOCRISY

Western leaders, politicians, religious leaders, writers, academics, business leaders, newspapers, media houses, news anchors, and commentators regularly clamor over each other, claiming to be the champions of democracy, human rights, and respect for the rule of law.

They screamed at the top of their lungs, criticizing the Russian war in Ukraine. They all fell silent and watched the genocide in Gaza. Some of them even applauded, with impunity, “We should kill them all.”

The US President, Joe Biden, even questioned the death counts in Gaza. His national security coordinator, John Kirby, shed tears in front of a live camera audience over the death of children in the Ukrainian war. John Kirby, without any shame for his hypocrisy, described the killings of innocent women and children in Gaza as a natural consequence of war, “*this is war, it is combat, it is bloody, it is ugly, and it is going to be messy, and innocence civilians are going to be heart going forward, I wish to tell you something different, I wish that was not going to happen, but is going to happen.*”

The war in Gaza exposed the truth about Joe Biden. As soon as the conflict started in Gaza, Joe Biden, the first president in US history, flew into the war cabinet of Israel with an entire US armada. He sanctioned the genocide of the Palestinians. Since Biden blocked every attempt by the United Nations for a cease-fire—it is no wonder he has also earned the title of #Genocide Joe. #Genocidejoe

A stream of Western leaders followed Genocide Joe to Tel Aviv, wagging their tails to pay respect to the Zionist master.

Given the brazen hypocrisy of the Anglo-Saxon Western leaders, The March 15th Forum undertook to seek the opinions of the Muslim community and invited the community to elect the Islamophobe of the year 2023 based on the following five criteria.

1. How did the individual impact news and events during 2023?
2. How much damage has the individual inflicted on the global Muslim community, either directly or indirectly, by aiding and abetting others?
3. Does the conduct of the individual show a pattern of hypocrisy when dealing with the Muslim community globally?
4. Does the individual have a long and established history of Islamophobia conducts.
5. Does the individual earn the title of Islamophobe by providing significant support to enable Islamophobia and consequential damage to the global Muslim community anywhere in the world?

The Forum provided a list of twenty-five world leaders. This is how the community voted. The three leaders, #JoeBiden, #Netanyahu, and #Modi, dominated the race and represented two-thirds of the total vote as if to hold the three leaders equally responsible for the bulk of #Islamophobia and the war in #Gaza in 2023. The three leaders were separated only by 2% margins. Joe Biden, however, got the highest vote, 26% of the total votes, followed by Netanyahu at 24% and Modi of India at 22%. Joe Biden earned the title the Islamophobe of the year 2023. #Islamophobeoftheyear

Other world leaders voted in were J F Kirby, Xi Jin Ping, #MBS (Mohamad Bin Salman), Victor Uban, #Bashir Al Asad, #Erdogan, #RishiSunak, #AmitShah, Pamela Gelleir, Daniel Pipes, Ben Gvir, and #BenShapiro. Their numbers were in the lower single digits and removed from the final presentation.

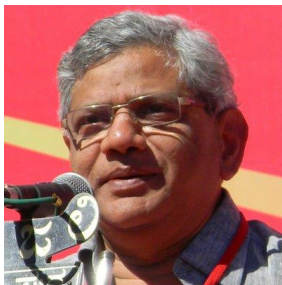

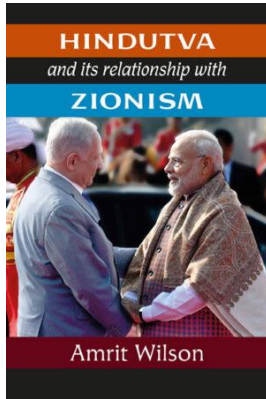

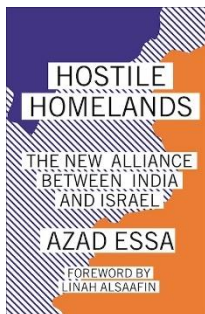

THE PRIVATE SECTOR WAS ABSENT FROM THE COMMEMORATION OF INTERNATIONAL DAY TO COMBAT ISLAMOPHOBIA

Honoring the occasion, various governments, educational institutions, and non-governmental organizations issued statements, and events were organized to commemorate the day, focusing on addressing the alarming rise in Islamophobic incidents globally. In 2023, despite widespread observance to commemorate International Day to Combat Islamophobia, there was a notable absence of participation from the private sector entities.

As per the United Nations Industrial Development Organization ([UNIDO](#)), the private sector must achieve a balance of economic, environmental, and social imperatives while at the same time addressing the expectations of shareholders and stakeholders. #UNIDO

The private sector takes resources in the form of raw materials, human resources, etc., from society, and they must give something back to society without prejudice, bias, and discrimination.

Unfortunately, the private sector failed to fulfill its corporate social responsibilities. The March 15th Forum invited over 200 hundred private sector and requested their response for commemorating International Day to Combat International, they remained nonresponsive. The private sector disregarded and was unwilling to stand in high-visibility events in solidarity with Muslims. THE MARCH 15th FORUM

- The Forum uses pledge strategy and participation in the International Day to Combat Islamophobia to grow awareness and combating Islamophobia.

SOLIDARITY REGISTRY

[The Solidarity Registry](#) contains names of the individual who were invited to attend International Day to combat Islamophobia. Individuals from the private sectors were selected with demonstrable potential to impact the efforts to combat Islamophobia. These selected individuals also have considerable engagement within the Muslim community. #solidarityregistry

We invited the private sector from the USA, India, and other countries. The Forum challenged them to defeat Islamophobia by promoting unity, tolerance, and solidarity with all humanity.

The March 15th Forum compiled the data and built a dossier on those disregarding and unwilling to stand in high-visibility events in solidarity with Muslims, and those either contributing to Islamophobia or indifferent to the plight of the victims of Islamophobia.

The Forum launched a community engagement program. The community engagement program asked the community to participate in electing Islamophobe of the Year 2023.

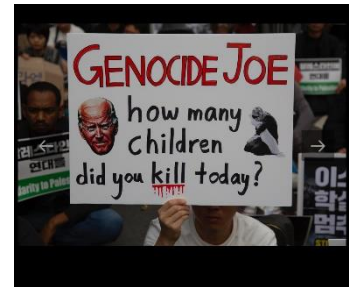

ISLAMOPHOBIA AND COMBATING ISLAMOPHOBIA

Islamophobia has become an epidemic because civil society and activists lack the tools to combat Islamophobia. The United Nations' designation of March 15, the “International Day to Combat Islamophobia,” is a significant success and offers the potential that civil society and policymakers can use to fight against Islamophobia.

Global Islamophobia is dominated by two large groups Anglo Saxon Western nations and India. India, by far, is the epicenter of global Islamophobia., where Islamophobia has become state policy. [United States Commission on International Religious Freedom \(USCIRF\), 2023 Annual Report:](#) Cited the following: The Indian government at the national, state, and local levels promoted and enforced religiously discriminatory policies, including laws targeting religious conversion, interfaith relationships, the wearing of hijabs, and cow slaughter, which negatively impact Muslims, Christians, Sikhs, Dalits, and Adivasis (indigenous peoples and scheduled tribes). Anglo-Saxon-Western brand of Islamophobia has the most extended history and is rooted in race and Judeo-Christian disdain for Islam. The recent wars in Ukraine and Gaza have exposed the hypocrisy and cruel nature of the *Anglo-Saxon-Western* brand of Islamophobia.

Indian Islamophobia, on the other hand, is a new phenomenon. The majority Hindu community is tolerant and peace-loving and has lived with Muslims peacefully over the millennium. A survey by US-based [Pew Research](#) suggests that 85% of Hindus respect all religious practices. It is common in India that millions of Hindus flock to Muslim shrines and places of worship to pay their respect.

Indian Islamophobia is driven by a narrow band of Brahminical Hindu radicals who call themselves Hindutva – a pre-historic belief based on a degrading and dehumanizing caste system. Hindutva is nothing but Brahminism ... fascism parading in the garb of Hindutva ([Outlook, India](#)). The Brahmins only form [approximately 4.3%](#) of the population but have historically held significant socio-political power. They have chosen Indian Muslims and Islam to seek global dominance.

The UN designation of March 15 as the ‘International Day to Combat Islamophobia’ invites, amongst others, the private sector to combat Islamophobia. The framers of the UN resolution required participation to combat Islamophobia by organizing and supporting high-visibility events to increase awareness about Islamophobia.

This high-visibility requirement offers a creative opportunity to identify those who are unwilling to stand in high-visibility events in solidarity with Muslims or support the fight against Islamophobia. Invite, and you will know who wants to avoid being seen and recognized at highly visible events.

The March 15th Forum, named after the UN resolution, has been established to use *International Day to Combat Islamophobia* effectively. The Forum aims to institutionalize the International Day to Combat Islamophobia and turn this landmark recognition into a highly effective tool to combat Islamophobia.

We have graded individuals and organizations and developed an **Islamophobia Scorecard**. The Islamophobia Scorecard catalogs their anti-Muslim activities: hate, prejudice, and discrimination against Muslims and Islam. The scoring matrix is attached here for review.

The Islamophobia Scorecard is expected to be used as a valuable tool to increase awareness about Islamophobia and hold individuals, organizations, and the private sector accountable for their Islamophobia. This is a research, fact-based, and data-driven system for accountability, and it is not a boycott.

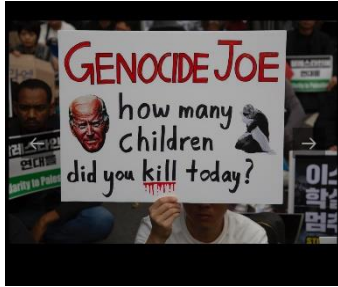

WHAT ISLAMOPHOBES WANT TO ACHIEVE

The Anglo-Saxon Western brand of Islamophobia is a new form of racism with both colonial and local focus.

In most Western nations, politics is about the influx of immigrants from Islamic and other non-white nations. Islamophobes and White supremacists view their racial dominance and way of life as threatened in their land.



As to the colonial ambitions of the Anglo-Saxon Western nations, it is the re-run of the barbarism the world has witnessed over the past three centuries. What is new is the types of weapons used and how the global system is manipulated to maintain hegemony.

The unholy alliance between white supremacists and the Zionist lobby drives the Anglo-Saxon Western brand of Islamophobia. The Western brand wants to continue subversion of the rest of the world, the Islamic and non-white world, and secure the patronage of their leaders.

The Indian brand of Indian Islamophobia, on the other hand, is a new pernicious colonizing campaign by Brahminical Hindu radicals based on a degrading and dehumanizing caste system. They aim to eliminate Islam from India and colonize the rest of the world, including Islamic countries. Destroying the Kaaba and installing Hindu idols are part of their agenda. This view is widely expressed in India with impunity. Here is an example.

We should invade the temple of Makkah (Kabba) from where the Cancer spreads.

Yati Narsinghanand Saraswati, is a prominent Hindu priest. Because of his [vocal anti-Islam stance](#) he attracts a wide audience on social media platforms. In April 2021, Saraswati held a press conference in Delhi, where he made insulting remarks about [Prophet Mohammad and Islam](#).

Yati Narsinghanand Saraswati's speeches have often been inflammatory, where he labeled Muslims as "[demons](#)" and expressed a desire for an India without Islam. The priest's alleged connections with the ruling political party, [Bhartiya Janata Party \(BJP\)](#), have also been debated.

During a speech, he expressed his strong views about the [Muslim holy cities](#), of Makkah as the root cause of a 'cancer', alluding to Islam. He said, "*The Hindu nation is a big dream.*

This is the dream of Veer Savarkar. A dream of Shivaji. All of us should have this dream in our eyes.



Not just limit to Afghanistan. But we should also invade the temple of Makkah (referring to Kaaba) where the Gangages of Mahadev (Hindu deity) flows in the form of ZamZam. If we don't get the Makkeshwar (referring to Makkah). If we do not erect a temple of Makkeshwar on Kabba. If you don't win the Makkeshwar Mahadev, then no power on earth can weaken Islam. You will have to win Makkeshwar Mahadev (referring to Kabba). You will have to attack (Makkah) from where the cancer spreads”.

He is not alone in his beliefs. Hindu [extremist groups, individuals](#), and [media house owners](#) regularly argue that the sacred Muslim cities of Mecca and Medina were originally Hindu sites that Muslim invaders transformed. They posit that these sites will one day be [reclaimed by Hindus](#). The [Hindu Mahasabha](#), a Hindu radical organization, has even labeled several Muslim pilgrimage sites as Hindu 'temples' in a New Year's calendar, including referring to Mecca as the Mahadev temple and the Taj Mahal as the Tejo Mahalaya Shiva temple.

It is essential to recognize that the expression of such extremist views is accepted as a norm and goes unpunished. Government and senior ruling party officials in India have neither criticized nor distanced themselves from those inflammatory views.

INDICTMENT OF THE ANGLO-SAXON WESTERN BRAND OF ISLAMOPHOBIA

The public indictment is not complex; it does not require thousands of words to explain it. It is on full display worldwide, with millions of citizens protesting and demanding to end it.

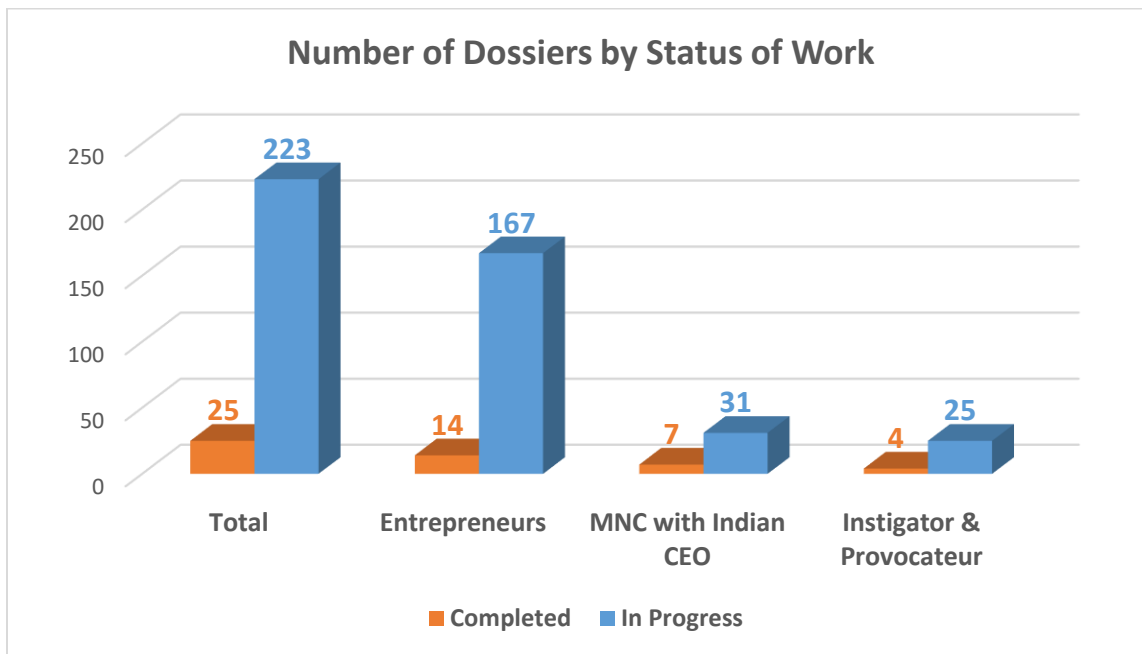

Dossiers at a Glance

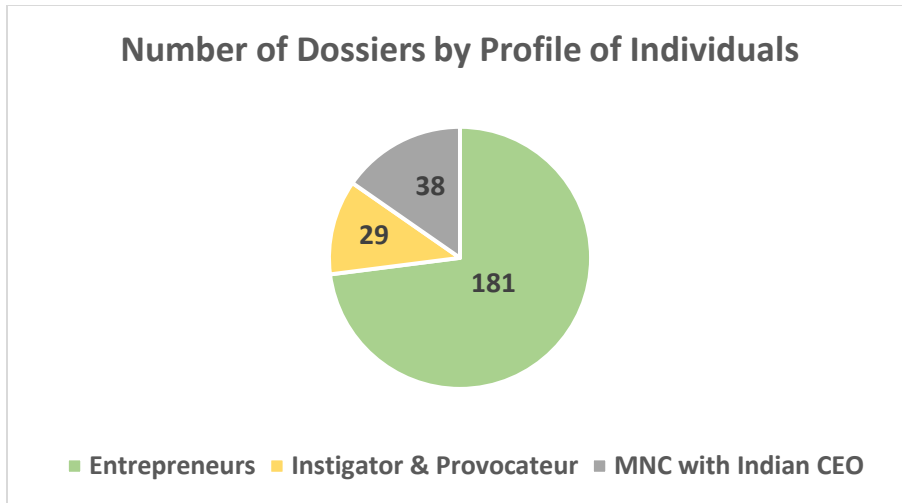
The Organization of Islamic Cooperation played a crucial role in endorsing the United Nations' declaration of March 15 as the "International Day to Combat Islamophobia." This initiative encourages various entities, including the private sector, to actively address and counter Islamophobia. It is acknowledged that the private business sector has an impact on perpetuating Islamophobia through its financial support to political parties, media outlets, and individual provocateurs. Furthermore, significant discrimination is identified in employment, corporate social responsibility (CSR) allocation, and leadership positions within these companies.

To gauge the extent of Islamophobia within corporations, the March 15 advisory has identified 248 entities, including corporations and individual provocateurs. Among these, detailed dossiers have been completed for 25, while work is ongoing for the remaining 223. This effort aims to comprehensively evaluate and assess the presence of Islamophobia within these organizations.

Profiles are divided into three categories: 1) entrepreneurs, 2) Indian CEOs of multinational corporations, and 3) individual provocateurs.

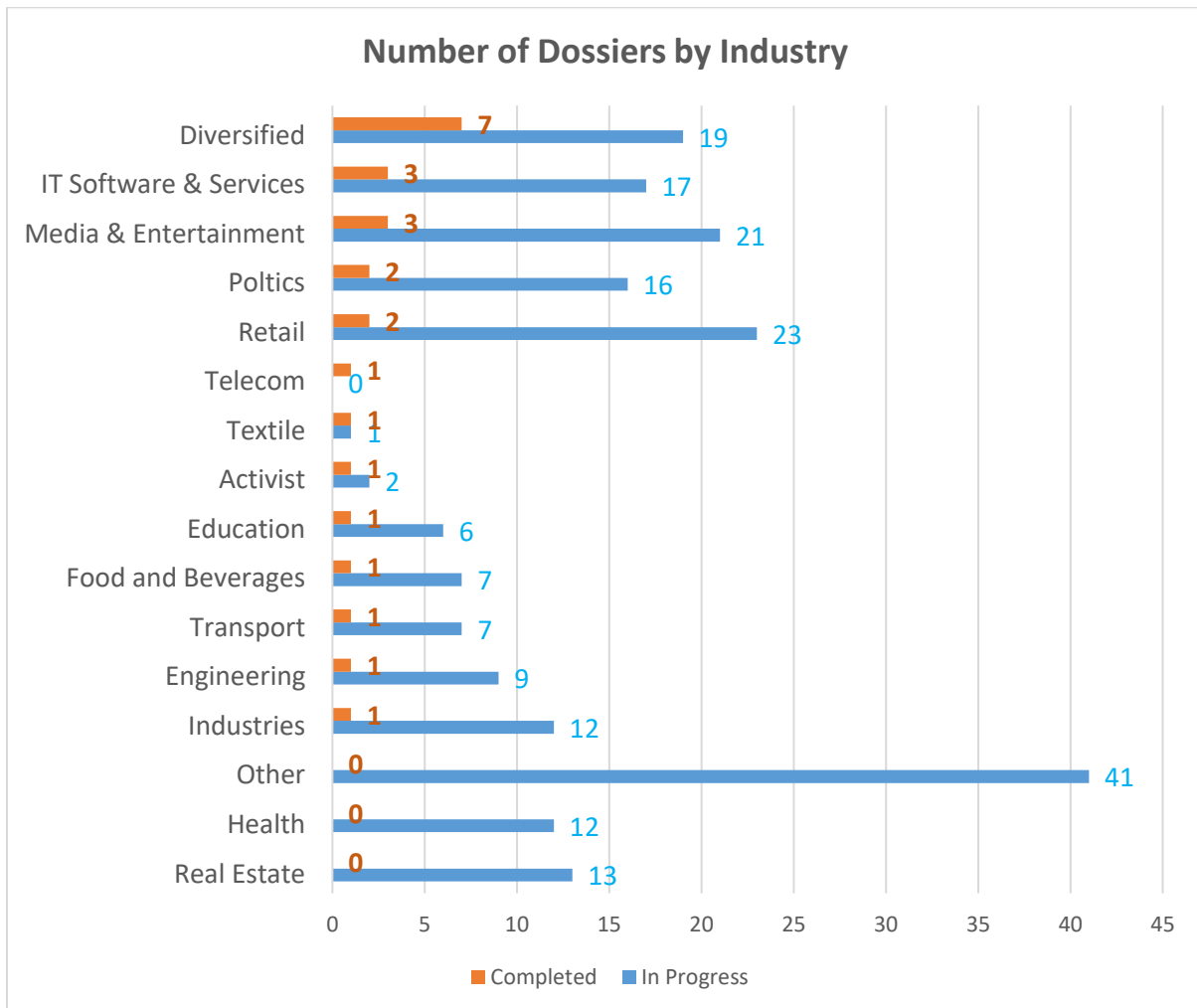


Number of Dossiers by Profile of Individuals

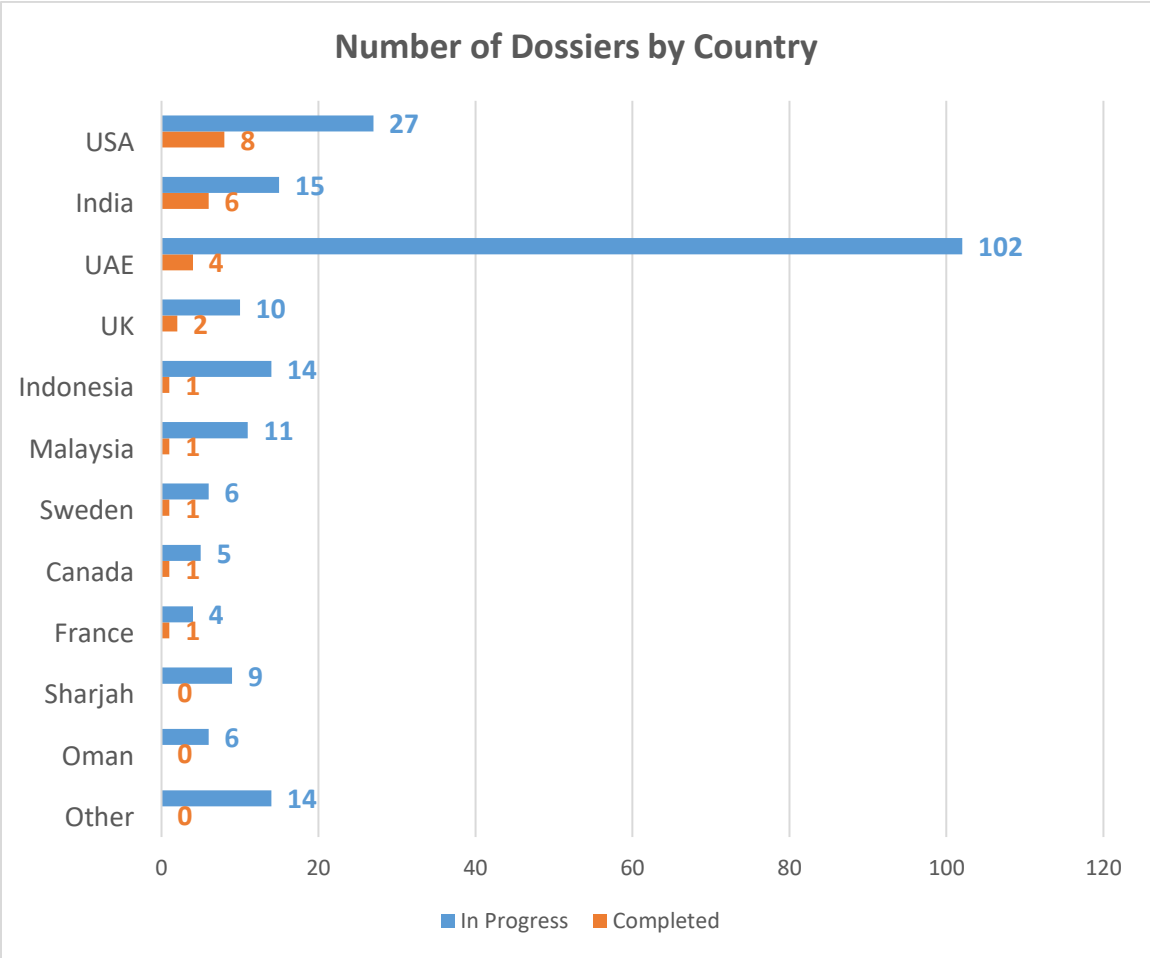

We also thank the Organization of Islamic Cooperation for initiating and advancing this historic and important proposal.

We know that Islamophobia has gone global. The Christchurch shooter who murdered 51 Muslim men, women and children in New Zealand on March 15th four years ago was just one horrific example of how dangerous anti-Muslim extremism can become.

Anti-Muslim bigotry and racism manifest across the world in different forms: hate speech, discrimination, restrictions on religious freedom, vandalism, violent crimes, arbitrary arrests, collective punishments, attacks on cultural and religious symbols, mass surveillance, unjust wars, ethnic cleansing, and even genocide. All of this is unacceptable, and all of it is interrelated.

Those who target Muslims in one country inspire others around the world to do the same and use similar rhetoric to justify their injustices.

Just as anti-Muslim extremists have united in their dedication to targeting Muslims, Muslims must unite in our dedication to defending each other and advancing justice for all people.

That’s why—on the historic occasion of the first International Day to Combat Islamophobia—our Muslim community organizations are coming together across borders, continents and oceans to announce our commitment to collaborate in the struggle against anti-Muslim bigotry.

In each of our nations, we work to advance the ideal that everyone deserves fair treatment regardless of race, religion, or ethnicity. We advance this ideal through constructive policy-based advocacy and campaigns. In each of our nations, we also benefit from diverse institutions and individuals who share this ideal.

Going forward, we plan to look for opportunities to advance this work at the international level.

As a start, we make the following joint calls to action:

1. Nations should recognize the UN International Day to Combat Islamophobia

We call on governments to recognize the International Day to Combat Islamophobia, condemn anti-Muslim bigotry and racism, dismantle Islamophobic policies and laws, and ensure that all of their citizens receive fair treatment under the law.

2. Muslim-majority nations should challenge Islamophobia internationally We call on governments in Muslim-majority nations to support and defend Muslims who experience Islamophobia in other countries, even if that means challenging the actions of economic partners and so-called allies.

3. Governments should protect places of worship from hate crimes

Places of worship are visible markers of religious identity and are therefore often subject to targeted attacks, harassment and abuse. Governments and authorities, at both the local and national level, must ensure places of worship such as mosques receive adequate protection, such as supporting the installation of preventative on-site security measures, responding swiftly to potential threats, and enforcing strong hate crime laws.

4. Political leaders should engage with Muslim constituents

We call on political leaders to establish constructive engagement with Muslim communities and a range of representative Muslim-led organizations on the issues impacting diverse Muslim communities nationally.

5. Communities should build bridges with neighbors of different faiths

We encourage our neighbors of different backgrounds, those of all faiths and none, to counter Islamophobia locally by availing opportunities to visit mosques in their neighborhood, connect with Muslim neighbors, and participate in anti-hate work.

Those who target Muslims want us to give up. They want us to stop caring about each other. They want us to stop working with our diverse neighbors. We say, No. We stand with our Muslim brothers and sisters, and all victims of injustice in not only our respective countries, but around the world.

We act with the faith that we will—God willing—survive the challenges of the present times and emerge stronger. And we plan to do so together.

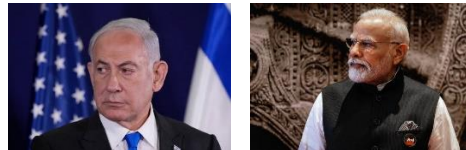
